BUILDING A BETTER COMMUNITY FOR ALL

The Quayle Trophy, a handsome silver bowl, was presented to the Blackpool Youth Committee in 1945 by Alderman John Robert Quayle JP for annual award to the “Best boy Athlete in Youth Service”.

Subsequently the Award rules were changed with girls becoming eligible for the Quayle Trophy.

The Trophy is now presented to the most outstanding young sports person aged 14-21 who resides in the Borough and who has achieved Regional, National or International level. The trophy is held during the current year of the award with a smaller replica for that person to retain.

In addition to the main trophy there are two awards for the same age group, which were originally donated by Councillor Mabel Quayle. The Quayle Shield was presented for the first time in 1999 by Mr Roy Thornton in memory of his family's involvement with the Youth Service in the town.

Mr Thornton a voluntary youth worker and Vice President of the National Council of Voluntary Youth Service and past Member of the Duke of Edinburgh Award National Advisory Council presented the Shield for outstanding achievement. The rules allow for a boy or girl in the age range of 9-13 to be nominated for the Shield. There are also two runner up awards in this category.

The Shield award is not just about sporting achievement alone but about commitment, sportsmanship and the support of less-able young people within their sport.

All short listed candidates for the Quayle Trophy and Shield are presented with a commemorative certificate by the current Mayor of Blackpool.

Nominations are requested each spring from local schools, sports clubs and youth organisations.

Who were the Quayles?

John Robert Quayle was elected to Blackpool Borough Council in 1921, and was made an Alderman in 1936. Mabel Quayle, became the first Lady Councillor of the Blackpool Borough in 1932. Both represented the Alexandra Ward and served on many Borough Council committees.

In 1937, children from Blackpool Schools were invited to the Mayor Making ceremony at the Town Hall, and Alderman Quayle offered three prizes for the best essays submitted by the children present, writing about the proceedings. Speaking to the children directly, he said that he hoped they would always put duty first, rights afterwards.

It was Alderman Quayle's strong desire that there should be more playing fields available for young people's recreation, so he appealed for land to be presented to the town especially for the Hawe Side ward.

Alderman Quayle became one of the first Governors of the Blackpool Technical College, and at the official opening of the College advocated working towards “The University of the Fylde”.

Alderman Quayle was the first Chairman of the Blackpool Youth Committee, serving for a number of years from its inception. In the Council Chamber he took another Alderman, who was Chair of the Parks and Leisure Committee, to task because Blackpool Boys' Club, a voluntary club, had been charged a five shilling fee (25 pence), to play football on a town pitch. He considered the town should give more support to young people.

Both are buried in Marton Cemetery near the main gate in the town that they both loved and served.

His sporting interests were:

Members of the Blackpool & Fylde Harriers;

President and past Captain of Blackpool Cycling Club (he had fame and reward as a keen cyclist in his younger days);

He was also a keen golfer.
